Quarter I Highlgiht: A New Propogation Greenhouse

In Quarter 2, Coastal Roots Farm's new propogation greenhouse was fully activated! The new greenhouse is larger with better ventilation and airflow, which helps to mitigate plant disease and pathogens. It is also much closer to our fields, helping to create a more streamlined flow from seed to field. Additionally, it is located front-of-house where guests enter from Saxony Road (adjacent to the soon-to-open Coastal Roots Coffee), expanding the community's exposure to and understanding of the full farming cycle, beginning with seeds or "starts!"



Sharing our Abundance

Springtime is abundant at Coastal Roots Farm! In Quarter 2, in addition to fulfilling our regular ongoing food distribution commitments, we were honored to share excess harvest with our partners at Jewish Family Service. These two speciality distributions channeled 385 pounds of food (valued at \$2,771) into their impactful Hand Up Food Pantry and The Corner Market programs.

A Wet Couple of Months

So far this year, our region has recieved nearly 12 inches of rain, significantly more than average. While benefits of such significant rain include reduced irrigation cost and pest pressure, excessive rain can damage soil, delay planting and harvesting, and create other stressors. This quarter, our dedicated team of farmers prioritized preventive maintenance on swales and dug trenches to divert water, protecting our fields and walkways. Now the Farm is looking as abundant as ever!

Welcome, Interns!

In Quarter 2, the Production Team welcomed three new interns to support all aspects of the farming cycle. Highlights have included transplanting this year's onion crop, supporting harvest and postharvest, and maintaining the landscape. Did you know? To date, Coastal Roots Farm has hired on 14 interns to the professional staff team.



JANUARY-MARCH 2024

9th Annual Tu B'Shvat Festival

Coastal Roots Farm's 9th annual Tu B'Shvat Food Forest Festival welcomed more than 500 attendees to the Farm on a rainy day in Quarter 2! This year's festival theme "Together We Grow" reminded us through tactile, holiday-inspired activities, that "Adam v'Adamah" (humankind and land) are interconnected. Programmatic highlights included a cooking class, climate-resiliency session, and Food Forest tour replete with Torah teachings. Program partners included: Chabad, Dr. Bronner's, Emma Tuttleman, Friendship Circle, Keshet from Israeli American Council, Produce Good, Solana Center, and Tree San Diego.



Introducing: Arts on the Farm!

To close out Quarter 2, Coastal Roots Farm, in collaboration with Limmud North America, produced the first community art-making day on the Farm, welcoming 44 participants and four teaching artists around the County. Though art tracks including visual arts, photography, theater/movement, creative writing, and instant choir, participants explored themes of Passover and Spring.

Nature Play News — Punch Pass, Purim, and Proliferation

It was another big quarter for Nature Play! Quarter 2 of 2024 reprents a 63% increase over the same time period in 2023 and a 129% increase over the same time period in 2022. This growth can be attributed to three highlights of the last few months: the expansion of Nature Play, previously offered only on Sundays and Thursdays to Fridays as well; offering a Nature Play punch pass, which promotes increased attendance at a lower cost; and a booming Purim-themed Nature Play day which welcomed 250 attendees including half who were first-time visitors to the Farm.

Coastal Roots Farm is deeply grateful to Las Patronas for their generous grant to purchase a new farm truck. This vehicle is crucial for our Organic Food Access Program to safely transport 80,000 pounds of food to food-insecure members in the community and onsite at the Farm. Thank you!
